



East Creag Mhor Walk

Distance: 3 miles (5 km)

Time: 1½ hours

A circular walk, starting at the Information Point by the footbridge and climbing about 200 metres up a forestry track onto the slopes behind the village, giving lovely views over the village and along Loch Earn.

From the footbridge and Information Point, cross the main road and walk up Shoemaker Lane, opposite. Go through the gateposts at the end, into the playing field area behind the village. Within a few metres, start bearing right. Then follow the path through a lightly wooded area, with the old railway embankment on your left. Continue along this path, between two fences, to a wooden 'kissing' gate, which takes you out on to Station Road.

Turn left, pass between the old railway abutments and then follow the forestry track that bears left, heading up the hillside. Keep to this track as it zig-zags up the hill, passing through a deer fence gate. *Please stop occasionally to look back and take in the views of the village and glen below.*

There is a seat, picnic table and a cairn on your left, defining the highest point of this walk. *This is an ideal spot to pause for refreshments and to enjoy the views both to the east and overlooking Loch Earn to the west.*

The track eventually levels out (now heading in a westerly direction). Continue along the forestry track, which now starts to descend, for about another 400 metres, reaching another deer fence gate at the 'T' junction with 'Peat Road'. Go through the gate,

turn left and keep to this track, zig-zagging all the way down until you pass over the old railway line.

50 metres on you will meet another track, turn left and continue down passing the Hydro Electric Power Station. Join the main road and continue eastwards, with the Loch on your right, back to the start at the Information Point and footbridge.
